The author believes that there are no clashes of civilizations, just clashes of ignorance and misunderstanding.

Pain Made Flesh examines the ways in which European and American painters have used oil paint and the human body to convey enduring human vulnerabilities, among them anxieties about desire, appearance, illness, aging, war, and death.
